The public is invited to attend the August meeting of the Shaler Garden Club with guest speaker Bob Mulvihill, National Aviary Omithologist.

With his vast knowledge of our feathered friends, Bob is returning to give us more tips to make our yards attractive and more productive for the birds. Healthy bird habitats reduce the use of pesticides and herbicides and time spent mowing. Bob has received awards on behalf of bird conservation from the Audubon Society of Western PA and the PA Society for Ornithology.


The year is 1916. Europe is embroiled in a horrific war. Within the clandestine world
