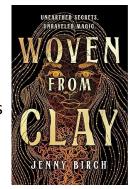

the contributions and cultures of the Indigenous peoples of the North American continent.—neh.gov



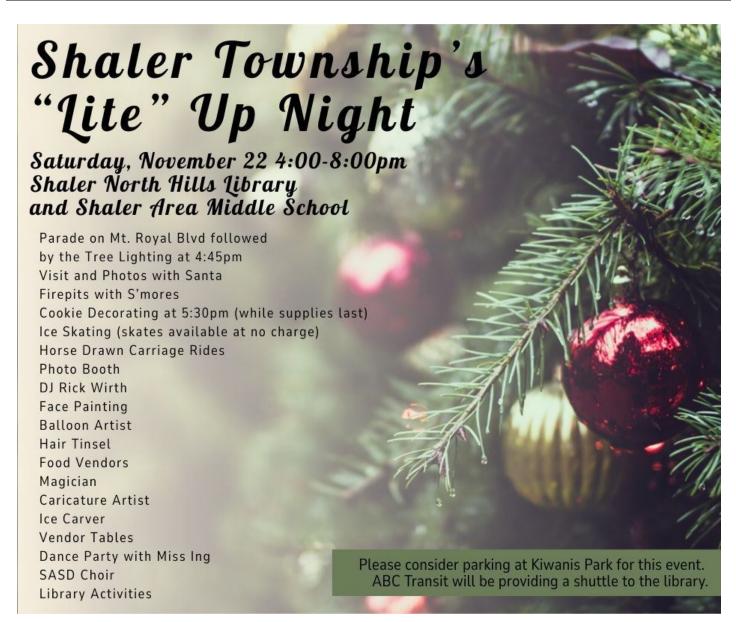
